

## Netball Mainland UMPIRE DEVELOPMENT MODULES

The Netball New Zealand Umpire Development Modules are offered to complement the coaching of umpires towards accreditation at various levels and further assist their development as an umpire.

Umpire Coaches should also be encouraged to attend and continue their learning.

It is acknowledged some Centres already have resources in use. However, there are many requesting assistance.

It is expected there will always be some modules which will need to be delivered in a face to face practical environment. Some modules will have pre-requisites for attending.

These modules can only be facilitated by NNZ approved facilitators, therefore the process for running one of these modules at your centre is as follows:

1. Select the module required by your Centre / or you could combine Centres (Clusters) together in the case of smaller centres
2. Approach the Zone Umpire Delegate with the dates and module you require
3. The ZUD will then appoint the facilitators to present this for you, or if you have connections with NNZ facilitators you can organise this directly.
4. The Centre will be responsible for the cost of the module
5. The Zone will give the Centres guidelines for the remuneration required for the facilitator. However, your Centre may decide to make payment by other means – petrol/grocery vouchers etc. This will be an arrangement between the Centre and the facilitator.

#### Fee structure/payment process for Umpiring Modules

1) Host Centres will co-ordinate the collection of fees from participants for NNZ Umpiring Modules at the recommended rates;

\$10 per person for 1 hour module                      \$15 per person for 1 ½ hour module                      \$20 per person for 2 hour module

2) Centres to determine how Facilitator remuneration will be paid in consultation with individual Facilitator for all NNZ Umpiring modules at the fees specified below regardless of facilitator;

1 hour module - \$50    1 ½ hour module - \$70    2 hour module - \$80

*NB if a facilitator is required to travel to facilitate a workshop then travel may be claimed at a rate of 30 cents/km for under 250km return trip and 40 cents/km for over 250km round trip from the home of the facilitator*

All surplus monies left after fees have been paid will be retained by the Host Centre to use in their Umpire Development Budget.
