# NATIONAL LEAGUE (NL)

As many will be aware, Netball New Zealand has undertaken a review of its national competition structure and as a result of this is proposing an exciting major initiative; the establishment of a NL starting in 2016. All 5 zones will have a team in this amateur competition, which will sit below the ANZC and is aimed at increasing the depth and capability of players and coaches under ANZC.

Planning is underway in NM with coach applications being called for and invitations sent out to over 23 identified players to trial for the Netball Mainland National League team. Trials will take place at the HPSNZ Apollo Projects Centre on Sunday 1 November from 4 – 6 pm.

Performance Squad and following strong performances throughout the 2015 netball season, the Netball Mainland (NM) selectors have invited over 50 players into the squad for either Level 1 or Level 2 programmes.

## Performance Squad Level 1

Up to 30 players, for players who are new to Performance programmes or NM Selectors feel that more experience is needed within this environment. Players are from Year 11 and older. This is considered a probationary year with players having to show improvement and commitment to the programme to be invited back. Players can be in this squad for 1 - 2 years.

## Performance Squad Level 2

Up to 20 players, for players who have been exposed to Performance environment previously and / or have demonstrated capability, understanding and commitment to a Performance programme. Continued improvement and commitment is expected. Players can be in this squad from 1 - 3 years.

Coaches will also continue to have the opportunity to align programmes with the player counterpart

# **PROPOSED NATIONAL LEAGUE**

One of the key recommendations from the recently completed Netball New Zealand Competitions Review was the introduction of a new amateur National League, sitting 'underneath' the ANZ Championship, a similar concept to the National League competition in Australia.

The key aims of introducing this competition being to:

- Win enhance competitiveness of NZ teams
  - o Build the depth of elite talent in NZ Netball
  - o Build selection pressure and options NZ franchise teams and Silver Ferns
  - Provide league based competition for the five NZ Zones to better prepare athletes, coaches, officials for elite and international competition
- Innovative and contemporary repositioning
  - Elite and visually dynamic, strong and stunning athletes
  - o Present a contemporary, youthful version of the game
  - Innovative change up the rules
  - o Professional and modern in its execution and presentation

#### • Grow profile and following

- Discover new talent
- $\circ$   $\;$  Build profile and following for Netball's future stars and the game  $\;$
- Build following and membership of NZ franchises
- Grow audience and increase connectivity













- o Broadcast, with both TV and digital focus
- o Grow the youth male and female supporter market
- Engages and grows the current Netball audience

It is proposed that this new amateur league will replace the current LFNC and Under 23 competitions from 2016 onwards.

Details of dates, teams, funding and format are being worked through currently, with further details to be presented by Netball New Zealand at the Netball Mainland Zone Forum in October.

## **NETBALL RULE CHANGES**

World netball bosses voted through a series of changes aimed at making the rules "less fussy" during International Netball Federation (INF) congress meeting in Sydney in August 2015.

All rules changes were put forward and had been developed with the consultation of INF's coaching advisory panel.

INF had been trialing a two-point shot from the outer-circle area, but this was not put to a vote at Congress after it was determined the rule required further trials.

The new rules will come into effect on **01 January 2016.** 

Key rule changes:

- The game management procedures in dealing with foul play have been standardised through the introduction of a four-step grading system. (The first level is a caution, escalating to a formal warning, before players can be sent off for two minutes. In serious cases, players can be ordered off for the remainder of the game).
- The use of injury breaks as tactical time-outs will no longer be possible, with all injury stoppages to be 30 seconds, and the injured player must come straight off the court.
- Players no longer have to wait for the infringing player to stand down (beside) properly before taking a penalty pass or shot.
- Umpires will no longer blow their whistle when goals are scored or the ball goes out of court. (It is predicted this measure will reduce the whistle in the game by 30 per cent).
- 'Goal-tending' is no longer allowed. Players cannot block a shot once the ball is on a downward arc.
