 - Ethnic and gender equality, opportunities for men and boys (49% of the population, huge opportunity to grow our sport) and ethnicities.




































Startling statistics from the "Sport NZ Voice of the Participant" survey which require our working on:

- > 50% of respondents saying that they had experienced or seen at almost every game or every game, some kind of poor behaviour, whether it be from a player, coach or person on the sideline. More work needed in the positive play/sideline behaviour space.
- Providing and supporting quality officiating/umpiring.
- Provision of player development pathways and opportunities.
- ➤ Clean and well-maintained toilets, changing rooms and courts this comes through in nearly every piece of research whether it be in other sports or events management. It really matters to participants and influences their satisfaction with your Centre.
