

INCORPORATED SOCIETIES

Netball New Zealand has been working with the Zones to ensure that all Netball Centres are up to date with their Incorporated Societies status.

Netball New Zealand (NNZ) requirement.

The NNZ Constitution (7.3 c) requires all Centres to be a registered Incorporated Society.

The status primarily;

- Protects the members of the Centre and ensures they are not personally liable for the society's debts, contracts or other obligations (Incorporated Societies Act 1908)
- Enables Centres to be eligible to apply for funding

TACTIX

MATCH PREPERATION

No matter what level you're coaching at there should be a similar routine.

The question I ask each of you is, do you rock up to your game, just play and react to what is presented?

I would imagine the answer is no.

Preparation is critical so that the players have the right information going onto the court.

Our team's preparation is similar, not identical as the week's change depending on when we play.

The most important information is the gathering of the opposition, who are their key players what are two or three aspects of their game that we should be targeting and what are the solutions that are going to upset their rhythm.

Once we have boarded this information our team tactics become evident.

Team tactics don't change dramatically each week; it's about twigging them to suit the team we are playing.

Consistency is one area that needs to be reminded, be consistent with the basic skills all the time.

Changing it up is another way of saying we are adding to our game plan. You never throw out the basics of your game plan but rev it up or change it up. It's a positive way of saying change.

Your energy as a coach is critical at this stage

As things are added you have to believe they will make a difference.

Players need to do their homework as well as the coaches, it cannot be one sided, the changes are owned by the players.

So preparation is complete from getting the plan sorted we then look at areas on court.

Shooters, what are your main focus for the game?















Mid court, what are you going to do to support this and what are you going to implement into your game?

Defenders, what are you going to do to disrupt the opposition shooters?

How are we going to Link together when there is a turnover?

Sharing this information will enable the team to all be on the same page.

Now that its established its implementation time.

Match day, remember It's not about over loading the players, it's just about reminding them of the critical things that need to be done. This can take 45 seconds before you go out on court. The captains should take over by this time and really it is in their hands.

As coaches we are there to guide and the player's implement the tactics, being flexible and plan for all the what ifs is also important. What if this player plays in another position? When you are going through each of the players, you need to consider this.

Good luck and remember that it's about the preparation that will get you on the right track.

Keep the basic plan simple and try not to confuse the players, often coaches brains are thinking over time and we are often guilty of putting too much into the plan.

Getting over the line is a joint journey and will change throughout the game. Revisit the general game plan at the beginning of each quarter to make sure the team is back on track for next quarter.

Keeping it clear and concise, clarification throughout the week is important.

I don't like the saying it Keep it simple stupid, as no one is stupid.

We prepare to win and all players plan to put out their best performance, no one plans for a poor performance.

Our job as coaches is to support and bring out the best of each player and blend it together into a great team performance.
