2017 NNZ AGM AND COUNCIL MEETING

This year was held in Queenstown, over the weekend of 25 and 26 February 2017.

AGM

Board Chair, John Bonguard and NNZ President, Bev Douglas welcomed delegates and observers and reflected on highlights of the 2016 year in their respective speeches.

Annual Report and Financial Statements were adopted.

Key points of note were:

- 2015/16 deficit of \$341k (costs mainly associated with split from trans-Tasman netball league, establishment of ANZP competition). Budgeted surplus of \$2k/breakeven was presented at last year's Council meeting.
- 2016/17 budget \$350k deficit (zone investment, funding 6th ANZP team, more SFs tests under SKY agreement.

NNZ Awards

Life Member Award: Leigh Gibbs

Former Silver Ferns captain and coach Leigh Gibbs has been made a Life Member of Netball New Zealand. Bestowed the honour at the 90th Netball New Zealand Council Meeting in Queenstown on Saturday, Gibbs becomes the 32nd Life Member.

She joins a who's who of Netball in New Zealand to receive the award including; Sheryl Lady Wells, Taini Jamison, Kereyn Smith, Dame Lois Muir, Dawn Jones, and Monica Leggat.

Gibbs was the 64th player to wear the Black Dress, the 11th captain and the sixth coach.

She represented the Silver Ferns in three Netball World Cups as a player (1979, 1983 and 1987) and coached them in 32 Test Matches between 1994-1997, including at Netball World Cup 1995, and was assistant coach in 2003 when the Silver Ferns last won the title.

HIGH PERFORMANCE

What is your teams AIMs, Values and mission for 2017?

This is the time for all Coach's to prepare their new look team.

What is it that your team wants to achieve this year and what are their values as a team that will help you get there?

It is important as a coach to sit down and discuss with the team what the team culture and team environment will look like. What are the behaviours that the team will accept and live by for the season. What are your aim, values and what is your mission to get to your goal at the end of the season?

One of our big ones this year for the Tactix is to train no less than 2% below what we play at all times. If we drop more than that then it becomes a walk through.

In 2016 our motto for the team was Better than Before. This year it's

Be the BEST. Be the best at everything they do on and off the court. If they raise the bar again and set the standard higher than before, opportunities will come.

All players need to have buy in on this and live what they agree to, they need to walk the talk at all times. If they believe in the team's values and aim, then the culture will become stronger.

If your club has a number of teams in the association, then alignment with the main body is important. We as a team looked at the values of Netball Mainland and aligned ourselves to their values. The major one that is vital with Netball Mainland was the one team approach. This relates to the coaching staff, Tactics and Beko, values of both teams and how we work together as an organisation. We are all on the same page, all of this is critical for moving forward. In our situation. There are players who will move between the two teams at different stages of the season, by having a one team approach it will make it easier for them.



Good luck and plan now be inclusive of as many stakeholders as possible as it will develop belief as a group.
