COACH DEVELOPMENT

This month we enjoyed our trip to Nelson where we caught up with some brilliant community

coaches at the Silvermoon Tactix training observation session, ahead of their game up there. Coaches loved the chance to watch the girls in action and chat to coach Marianne Delaney-Hoshek.

Also, this month our new Coach Development Officer, attended a three-day Coach Developer training programme in Auckland led by Sport NZ. The training was a great opportunity to mix and learn from the other 16 Coach Developers from different sporting codes as well as the highly skilled trainers.



The training programme aims to help staff understand their role as a Coach Developer; learn different ways of creating effective learning environments; and be able to demonstrate the coach developer skills of observation, questioning, listening and giving feedback.

Some of the key goals in the coach development space in the coming months are:

- visit all the centres to continue to build relationships and obtain a sense of understanding of where each Centre is at and find out what support they need from the zone and the wider community.
- Continue with the mentoring initiative, Geni will be in touch to help you set this up soon
- Continue to support and grow our network of independent Coach Developers. The second phase of training for this wonderful group of people is on the 18th of July and will be led by Netball Mainland, Netball New Zealand and Sport New Zealand.



INCORPORATED SOCIETIES

Netball New Zealand has been working with the Zones to ensure that all Netball Centres are up to date with their Incorporated Societies status.

Netball New Zealand (NNZ) requirement.

The NNZ Constitution (7.3 c) requires all Centres to be a registered Incorporated Society.

The status primarily;

- Protects the members of the Centre and ensures they are not personally liable for the society's debts, contracts or other obligations (Incorporated Societies Act 1908)
- Enables Centres to be eligible to apply for funding

YEAR 7 AND 8

As you may have seen, there has been a fair amount of ill-informed commentary and media attention around the 'scrapping of year 7 and 8 representative teams.' This is not new as such, for example the Christchurch Netball Centre has never had rep teams at this age group.

There will still be competition across this age group, 'winning' and 'losing', just no selected representative teams. Instead, we will see more kids involved in open entry tournaments and development programmes focued around key netball skills, nutrition, mental skills. This is in-line with international, Sport NZ, HPSNZ and NNZ research/evidence.

The Sport NZ Talent Plan was released in July 2016, which provides the mandate and direction for sports such as Netball, to take bold and courageous steps to make changes to pathways and competition structures to ensure:

- a. More kids stay involved in sport; and
- b. Ensure those with potential for the future are able to realise that potential later in life as a senior athlete (to be able to win when it counts as a Tactix or Silver Fern not as an 11 year old)

There are three key messages that sit in the Talent Plan:

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- Early specialisation in sport is not good (we encourage kids to play multiple sports)
- \circ $\,$ In most cases childhood success does not lead to adult success $\,$
- Successful athletes don't focus on winning...they focus on development and getting better

Netball Mainland Development Squad

Six netballers have been named in a new "pathway to Tactix" squad which has been created to identify and support players from within the Netball Mainland Zone. In addition, Marianne will also be visiting some successful sporting franchises over the coming months, to gain valuable insights into other performance environments.

A note from the Head Coach:

Team culture and environment is one of the most important factors in any team. As part of this, I love the idea of having a theme to work to and always have one in my teams as it keeps things fun and fresh. I also love making up the motivation speech for game day. My address on game day is purely motivational as the girls should all know the game plan well by then. I have a great deal of fun connecting our theme to the game we are playing and tyring to say the things I think will get the girls pumped for the first quarter.

I have enjoyed meeting up with Scott Robertson at the Crusaders this week to see if we can make some connections for our teams in future and just have a good old coaching catch up. Scott is a great environment/culture based coach and has some awesome ideas. I have also been lucky enough to catch up with Wayne Smith and listen to his ideas around changing different cultures he has been involved with.

Setting personal goals for games is an important part of any professional team. Pete Bowden, our Performance Analyst has bought in some excellent tools for us in this space. On court, we are making gains in many areas and it is important to acknowledge these. We have some performance measures that we look at such as centre pass to score, defensive gains etc., that we try and hit in every quarter. We also have a measure of intent called the intentometer!

Our support through thick and thin is unbelievable- our fans, members, sponsors and families are so important to us. Netball Mainland has true family values and we would so love to have a few wins to acknowledge the hard work the girls are doing, as well as our support crew. This could be the week!
